## Activity 12: How did we do?

### Learning Objective

- To evaluate the success of the enterprise and the role played by those who worked for it.

### Entrepreneurship Characteristics

### Learning activities

Discuss with pupils the importance of reviewing what they did and, by referring back to their Enterprise Troopers action plan, if they achieved what they set out to do.

Ask the pupils to suggest changes to the way in which they would plan and carry out a similar enterprise in future.

Using **Resource 12 – My Evaluation Checklist**, pupils identify their own personal successes – what they did well and what they could do even better next time?

Pupils debate and decide what to do with any profit.

Ask the pupils to give a presentation on their enterprise to the rest of the school. This presentation would be part of the school's entry for the national competition and also a starting point for other enterprise projects that the school might carry out in the future.

Pupils' achievements are recognised and celebrated by the school, governors and by parents.
