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NACUE Varsity Pitch	business competition for students and recent graduates (within the last 5 years). Tranzfuser Talent Programme	delivered by UK Games Talent supplies a pipeline to enterprise and/or employment recognition for new UK games graduates, taking teams from concept and prototyping through to publishing.
UK Games Fund	For teams in the very early stages of development or with limited professional experience, the Pitch Development Programme offers the chance to refine and improve pitching skills and develop a playable demo over the course of the summer, with a support package provided to the value of £10,000.
