A total of 470 applications were submitted, 18 were cancelled by the Service Centre and a total of 12 applications were not supported.

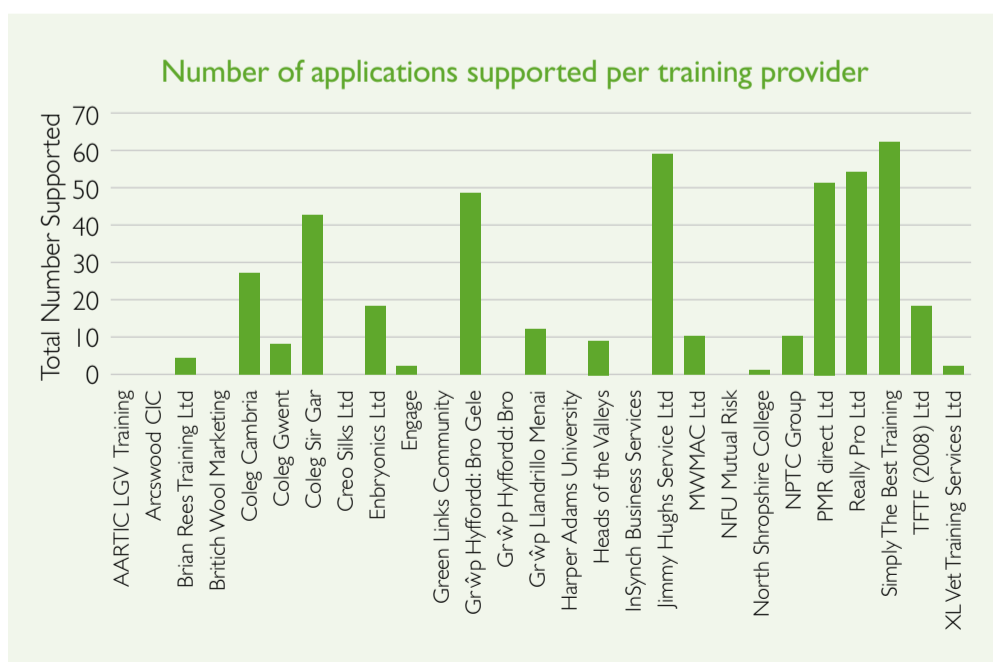

### Application Statistics for Window 6

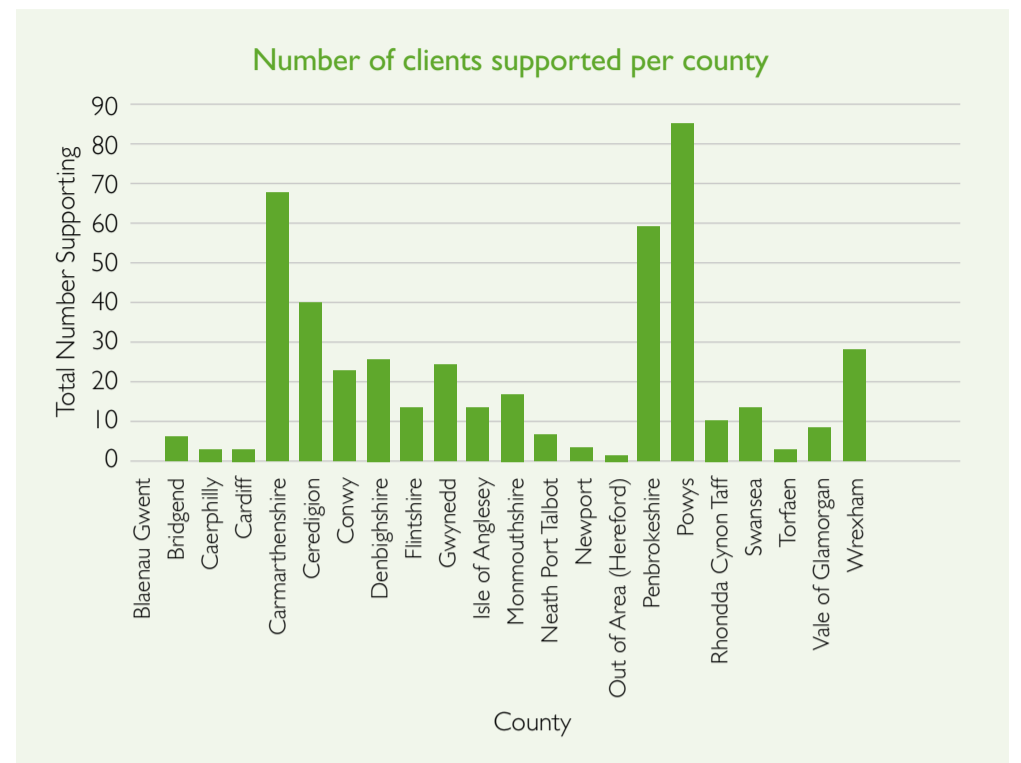
The breakdown provided in the chart below shows the number of applications supported for clients per age range.



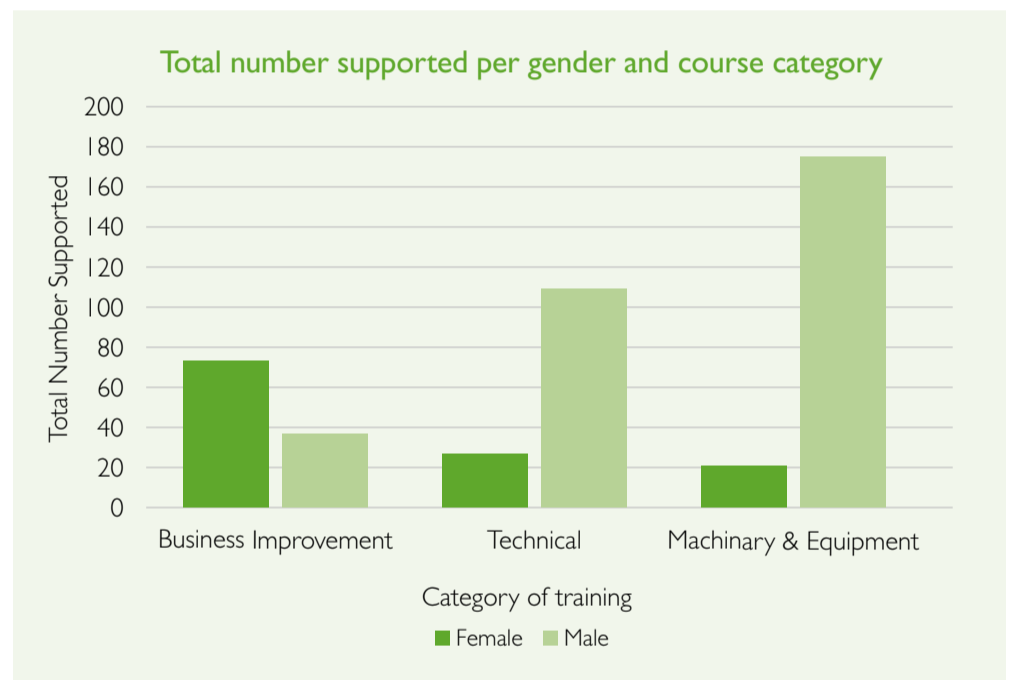
The following chart displays the number of Application Approvals per Training Provider.

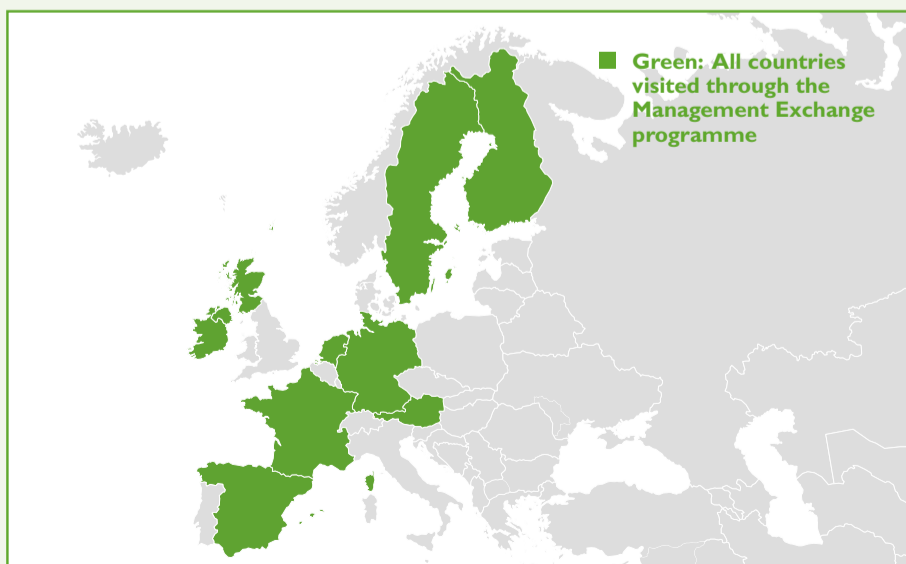


## Exchange ■
