Key project outcomes included:

- 27% protein concentrate feed produced for the farm resulted in a cost saving of £5,588
- Legume nitrogen-fixing has generated up to 100kg/ha nitrogen for the following wheat crop worth \pounds 1508 and saving 2.27 tonnes of co2 equivalent
- Reduced total nitrogen applications to 50% only reduced grass growth by 10% and resulted in a cost saving of £80/ha
- Installing agroforestry is likely to make over \pounds 10K per year from fruit lanes once established
