




MASTER LAMENESS

When considering your flock currently, what percentage of your flock would you say is lame? (tick the box)



Points to remember

Three main different types of foot lameness

- > Scald- skin of cleft between claws is inflamed, moist and swollen
- > Footrot- smells and starts as scald between claws and spreads to separation of the horn near the heel
- > CODD starts with a sore area at the coronary band (top of hoof) and spreads down the claw, and in severe cases the whole horn capsule is detached leaving the claw raw and exposed
- > Other types of lameness include pedal joints abscesses and granuloma, shelly hoof and white line (toe abscesses)

• Treat immediately after seeing signs of lameness and mark/tag ewes to see if treatment has been successful and to give follow up treatment if required

Reduce disease challenge	OUARANTINE

• Quarantine any purchased stock or sheep that have been off on tack

Reduce disease challenge **AVOID**

• Keep areas clean and wash/disinfect handling areas if possible, to avoid spreading the bacteria, move creep feeders and mineral buckets and use clean straw and disinfect/lime in housing

Establish immunity **VACCINATE**

• Speak to your vet regarding suitable vaccination plan for your farm
