

Small Growers Supplier Standard

Developed by Farming Connect Horticulture

Food businesses (*including growers*) are often obliged to meet the requirements of a food safety standard. This is to show that they meet basic food safety requirements to produce safe food. For growers, there are many risks that can easily be controlled to reduce the risk of food outbreaks being linked to their produce.

Farming Connect Horticulture has worked with ML3 Technical Services to devise the Small Growers Supplier Standard. This takes the ethos of the Red Tractor Standard but focuses the requirements around small market gardeners.

Whilst Red Tractor is a recognised standard, it is costly, time-consuming, and onerous for small growers and not suited to market gardeners who grow many different crops.

The Small Growers Supplier Standard has sections on documentation, traceability, risk assessment, farm standards, pest control, crop nutrition,

crop growing, irrigation, harvesting, people, health & safety, as well as additional sections for packing areas and non-organic crop production where relevant.

The system has been written by an experienced fresh produce auditor who understands both the requirements of the customer for due diligence and the practicalities of growing produce on a small scale.

For customers who are BRCGS certified, additional supporting documents can be provided to show how the system can be used within the limitations of the BRCGS Supplier Approval clauses.

Support is provided by Farming Connect Horticulture to the growers through food safety training (*specific to growing fresh produce*), 1 to 1 support, and webinars that are all aimed to reduce the risk of food safety issues with fresh produce.

Ysgrifennwyd y system gan archwilydd cynnyrch ffres profiadol sy'n deall gofynion y cwsmer o ran diwydrwydd dyladwy ac ymarferoldeb tyfu cynnyrch ar raddfa fach.
