



#### **Case Study**

#### **EID Roadshow**

This drop in session at Welshpool Livestock Market proved to be very successful with many farmers stopping by to discuss the new sheep recording changes. Some farmers had brought their EID readers with them in order for the reps from the EID companies to help them understand how to use the equipment and implement on new livestock movement rules.

The event increased awareness of the new rules as a number of farmers present were unaware of the changes. It also gave farmers an opportunity to discuss with EID companies which system would be best for them.

#### **Case Study**

Robert Fleming, AgriScot Scotch Beef Farm of the Year 2017 visited a Beef Discussion group in Anglesey to disucss how he has maximised production per hectare five-fold, whilst lowering costs.

The main key performance indicators according to Robert, are:

Output per hectare

£ of concentrate purchased to the Kg of liveweight gained

£ of fertiliser used to the Kg liveweight produced

He stressed the importance of starting with analysing the soil nutrients on farm, and then taking action to get the soil to the optimum pH status. His system is based on maximising grass growth with most fields producing between 13 and 23t/DM/Ha.

The following actions should be taken to increase productivity:





Weigh and measure crops



Optimise soil quality



Measure rations
