




# Tilhill Forestry (Wales and Marches)








### **Threats to our Business**

- Pests and disease phytophthora, red band needle blight, ash dieback etc
- Changing climate growing conditions becoming unsuitable for some species?
- Welsh Government regulations becoming restrictive and unworkable resulting in less woodland creation - investors may walk away.
- Failure to promote the real benefits of commercial forestry carbon sequestration, sustainable materials, jobs, biodiversity, landscape, recreation, health, flood prevention, water quality etc
- Browsing mammals present a challenge to foresters grey squirrel and deer.
- The lack of a skilled workforce is a challenge we face today and into the future – we need to invest in skills.
- Public perception many outside the industry have a negative perception of harvesting trees for wood. There needs to be a campaign to educate the public about the benefits.






# **Opportunities**

- Global timber demand is set to quadruple by 2050.
- 80% of our timber is imported we need to invest in woodland creation today to supply our future needs in 30-50 years. We need to act today, not next year.
- Climate change is here we need to plant more woodlands to fight climate change and sequester carbon.
- Wales is forecasted to be a favourable place to grow timber.
- Strategic tree planting can reduce flooding.
- The value of timber is increasing.
- People value woodlands for recreation and conservation.
- Carbon is a tradable asset.
- Welsh Government want to plant more woodlands.





## What we need from WG and FR

- We need to understand and restrict the threats from pests and disease this should be a key action for Forest Research and Welsh Government.
- We need to promote the use of home-grown timber.
- Welsh Government needs to decide what they want. You can't have it all. Tree planting is being squeezed between food production and biodiversity. There is very little room left. 180,00ha of new woodland by 2050 no way! WG verified less than 700ha last year.
- Should we be pulling back on the restrictions on tree planting to achieve this ambition?
- Should we be planting poor quality priority habitats?
- Find a solution for grey squirrels.
- We need to invest in skills.
