


A local company broadcasting on a global scale

Skype TX is used by reality TV shows such as X Factor but they also enable services whereby patients can connect

directly and in real-time with their GP via an iPad.

Richard says: "Going through the process with the Welsh Government supporting us made all the difference. They helped us to secure the funding we needed to deliver our services, as well as helping us reduce our costs, and develop our business plan".
