Apprenticeship Framework in The Gas Industry

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The content of this Framework has been agreed and published by Energy & Utility Skills.

OVERVIEW:

This Framework specifies the standards and criteria for the delivery of Levels 2 & 3 training provision within the Energy sector. Successful completion of the provision will lead to the award of a designated/regulated qualification(s) within the sector.

The Level 2 Apprenticeship is suitable for a variety of roles including Gas Mains Layer - (Self Lay / Distribution / Repair and Maintenance). Gas Service Layer - (Self Lay / Distribution / Repair and Maintenance).

The Level 3 Apprenticeship is suitable for a variety of roles, including First Call Operative. Gas Installation Engineer / Gas Maintenance Engineer / Gas Installation & Maintenance Engineer – (Gas Fired Wet Central Heating). Gas Installation Engineer / Gas Maintenance Engineer – (Gas Heating and Energy Efficiency). Craftsperson, Technician, Network Technician, Senior Network Technician.

MANDATORY OUTCOMES

Achievement of these qualifications will be assessed by verification through the appropriate awarding body. Participants must complete:

- Either a competence and a knowledge qualification or a combined competence and knowledge based qualification from one of the following pathways.
- Essential Skills and the Employment Rights and Responsibilities as stated below.
