OVERVIEW:

This Framework specifies the standards and criteria for the delivery of Level 2, 3 & 4 training provision within the Health Care Services occupations. Successful completion of the provision will lead to the award of a designated/regulated qualification(s) within the industry.

The Level 2 Apprenticeship aims to provide the skills and knowledge required to become a Health Information Assistant.

The Level 3 Apprenticeship aims to provide the skills and knowledge required to become an Assistant Practitioner (Informatics).

The Level 4 Apprenticeship aims to provide the skills and knowledge required to become an ICT Support Technician, ICT Test Analyst, Information Analyst, Senior IT Specialist.

MANDATORY OUTCOMES

Achievement of these qualifications will be assessed by verification through the appropriate awarding body. Participants must complete:

- Either a competence and a knowledge qualification or a combined competence and knowledge based qualification from one of the following pathways.
- Essential Skills and the Employment Rights and Responsibilities as stated below.
