Employment Allowance

As a business and your employers' Class 1 National insurance liabilities were less than £100,000 in the previous tax year, you may be able to receive support in reducing your annual National Insurance liability.

ReAct+

Employers can receive funding support to recruit individuals who are not currently in education, employment, or training, with up to £3,000 towards their first year's wages and up to £1,000 towards training. Should you employ a young person you can access further funding of up to £1,000 and up to £2,000 if the new employee has a disability. The new employee must be working for at least 16 hour a week and be employed for a minimum of 12 months.

Through the ReAct+ support, employers can receive up to £3,000 for employing young people that 18-24 years old and not currently in education, employment or training (paid at 50% for part-time employees). The amount received will depend on the length of employment and is paid in 4 stages, and the young person must remain employed for 13-52 weeks.
