Welsh territorial seas cover some **32,000 square km** making Wales's marine area much bigger than its territorial landmass.











The global challenge

Up to 12.7m tonnes of plastic enters the world's oceans every year, equivalent to dumping one rubbish truck of plastic per minute into the world's oceans. (UNEP 2017)





Volvo Ocean Race - Sustainability Pillars





- 1. To minimise the race's own footprint with a particular focus on reducing and where possible eliminating the use of single-use plastic by the teams, and in the Race Villages
- 2. To maximise the race's impact using its global communications platform to spread awareness, an educational programme to change views, and a science programme, using the Volvo Ocean 65 racing yachts to capture data while at sea and contribute to our understanding of the oceans in the most remote areas of the planet.
- 3. To leave a positive legacy wherever it goes, through many actions but in particular the creation of Ocean Summits to bring together science, government, sport and business, with an objective of getting attending parties to commit to new positive actions in this area.

UN Environment launched #CleanSeas in February 2017, with the aim of engaging governments, the general public, civil society and the private sector in the fight against marine plastic litter.

- National Awards also include the Green Coast Award which encourages volunteer adoption of beaches – Wales has 25 Green Coast Award sites!
- In the UK, the Seaside Award is also granted to sites with exceptional facilities - 85 awards were given in 2017!

Keep Wales Tidy also run the international **Eco-Schools programme** In Wales which champions environmental education. We've reached 94% of schools in Wales!



PLASTIC FREE COASTLINES



- Aberystwyth Town Council supports the Plastic-Free Coastline campaign initiated locally by Surfers Against Sewage.
- The Town Council undertakes to ensure that single-use plastic items are not used at its premises and functions.
- As part of the initiative, the Council also "agrees to support the campaign to discourage and reduce the dispensing of single-use plastic from retail premises within our coastal town in order to assist in reducing street litter and contribute to the global campaign against marine pollution."
