- 1 Contact Powys County Council's Community Broadband Officer (broadband@powys.gov.uk)
- 2 Form a project group
- 2a Contact your local community/ town council
- 2b Contact your County Councillor (<u>Find my councillor Powys County Council</u>)
- 3 Contact broadband suppliers to enquire about working with them to connect the community, once you have the responses it will be time to choose
- 4 Define the scope of the project (this is commonly the community/ town council area)

Funding is only released to the broadband supplier once the properties have been connected



Is your property eligible for a Gigabit Voucher?

- Working with your chosen supplier engage with the community to make them aware of the opportunity and gauge the level of interest.
 - > From this point the chosen broadband supplier will tend to take the lead
- Once there is evidence of enough interest in the local community the broadband supplier will prepare and submit a funding application to the Department of Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) in UK Government who are responsible for the UK Gigabit Voucher Scheme
- 7 When the funding is approved DCMS will contact all the interested properties to check that they would like to be connected by the scheme





- The supplier will begin their detailed survey work and once this is complete the network build will begin
- 9 When the property is connected DCMS will get in touch to confirm this has happened. Once DCMS receive conformation they will release the voucher funding to the supplier
