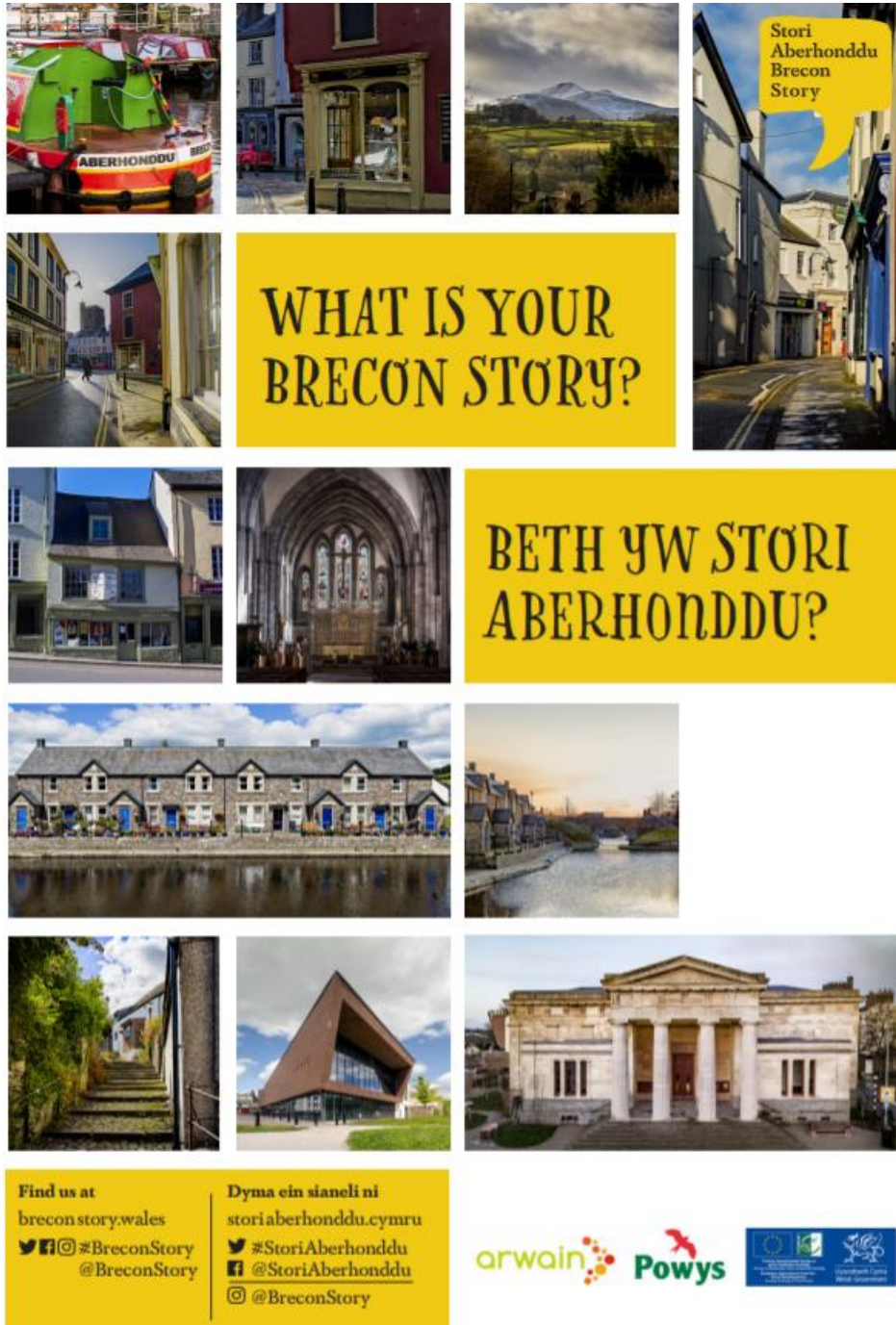

Launch of Brecon Story celebrates Brecon's heritage, culture and arts scene

To shed light on just what makes Brecon such a special place, the Brecon Heritage & Cultural Network has launched Brecon Story. This bilingual online portal breconstory.wales and storiaberhonddu.cymru provides an immersive insight into Brecon's past and present, with revealing glimpses into the town's history and cultural attractions. As well as being a fascinating resource for locals interested in learning more about where they live, the portal is packed with interesting stories for all visitors – those spending a few hours in the town or staying overnight.

Developed over the past 12 months and supported by a major grant, Brecon Heritage and Cultural Network brings together a range of local stakeholders to promote the town's many hidden cultural assets.

Designed with the community at its heart, the portal is a cultural hub that encourages Brecon residents to get involved by recounting their own stories, sharing pictures and videos on social media channels and volunteering to help others who wish to tell stories of their own.

Dean of Brecon The Very Reverend Dr Paul Shackerley, Chair of Brecon Heritage and Culture Network explained "For the very first time those with an interest in Brecon's heritage culture and arts can join the network and work collectively to tell, not just the people in Wales but nationally and internationally, that Brecon is worth a visit to discover its cultural heritage. By working together Brecon has a much stronger voice. We invite the people of Brecon to join in and tell their stories about why Brecon is a special place".

Alongside Brecon's residents, the Network is supported by many of the town's heritage and cultural organisations. These include project leader Brecon Cathedral, Found Gallery, Gate Gallery and Glassworks, Theatr Brycheiniog, The Regimental Museum of the Royal Welsh



and y Gaer, The Brecknock Society, The Muse, plus individual residents who have volunteered their time. Highlighting the Network's value to businesses in the town especially those welcoming visitors, it is also backed by Brecon Town Council and Visit Brecon, Powys County Council Tourism Unit, Brecon Beacons Tourism and Brecon Beacons National Park Authority.

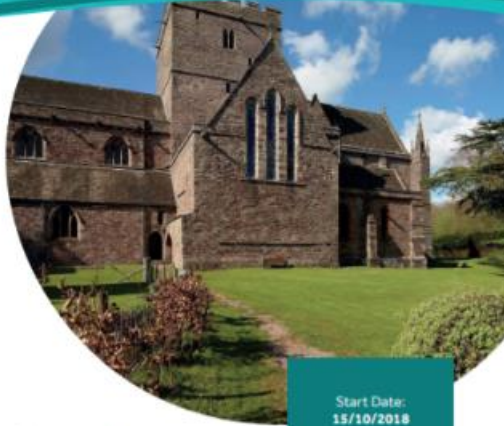

DEVELOPING THE BRECON HERITAGE AND CULTURAL NETWORK

A digital network is being developed to raise awareness of Brecon's rich heritage and the vibrancy of its cultural and artistic life.

The project will unify attractions and organisations in the heritage, culture and arts sectors in Brecon and encourage a sharing culture and the exchange of knowledge and information between partners. Individuals and groups in the community with an interest in putting the town on the cultural map, are encouraged to join stakeholders, volunteer their time and participate in highlighting to both residents and visitors, what the town has to offer.

The concept for the Brecon Heritage & Cultural Network emerged from the Agincourt 600 Wales project in 2015, when Brecon Cathedral took the lead in bringing together Brecon's heritage attractions along with a range of community organisations, to commemorate the role played by the Brecknock Archers in King Henry V's stirring victory.



This event caught the imagination of local people, many of whom contributed to, or participated in the activities. The project sparked enthusiasm with a committed band of volunteers supporting 'The Great Brecknock Pageant' however a limiting factor was the lack of capacity at our heritage attractions. We also learnt that Brecon people are our best ambassadors. It is this learning experience that has helped inform the innovative digital approach behind the Brecon Heritage & Cultural Network collaborative project.
