LESLEY GRIFFITHS MS, Minister for Environment, Energy and Rural Affairs

Lesley Griffiths was brought up in North East Wales and has lived and worked in Wrexham all her adult life. She has two daughters and has served as a school governor and community councillor. She worked at the Wrexham Maelor Hospital for 20 years. Prior to her election she worked as constituency assistant to Ian Lucas, MP.As a strong supporter of devolution for Wales, she played an active role in the 1997 'Yes for Wales' campaign. She was elected to the National Assembly for Wales in May 2007 and served on several Assembly Committees. She set up and chaired the Cross-Party Hospice Group. In December 2009, she was appointed Deputy Minister for Science, Innovation and Skills. Following re-election to the National Assembly for Wales in May 2011, Lesley Griffiths was appointed Minister for Health and Social Services and in March 2013 was appointed Minister for Local Government and Government Business. In September 2014, she was appointed Minister for Communities and Tackling Poverty. In May 2016, following re-election, she was appointed Cabinet Secretary for Environment and Rural Affairs. Lesley was appointed Cabinet Secretary for Energy, Planning and Rural Affairs on 3rd November 2017. On 13th December 2018, Lesley was appointed Minister for Environment, Energy and Rural Affairs. Outside of politics, her main hobbies are music, walking and watching Wrexham Football Club. Lesley is formerly an elected director of the Wrexham Supporters Trust.



OLLIE OLLERTON

As one of the first former UK Special Forces members to talk openly to the media and reveal his true identity, Matthew 'Ollie' Ollerton has an incredible story to tell. A former Special Forces operative with both the SAS and SBS, Ollie has undertaken operations in some of the most dangerous and remote locations on the planet and is one of the most highly trained fighters in the world. After leaving school and joining the Royal Marine Commandos, Ollie's exploits soon earned him his recommendation for the SAS. There he undertook high profile missions involving hostage rescue, counter narcotics and counter terrorism, amongst other things. Ollie then went on to use his expertise as a private bodyguard where he was responsible for employing and training a 2,000 strong Iraqi guard force, before heading to South-East Asia to command a three man team infiltrating child trafficking rings, a cause that is still close to his heart today. Ollie returned to the UK in 2014 after 13 years overseas and started developing a concept that would put his years of training and experience to use and would benefit others. With this, BREAK-POINT was born; a leadership programme of performance tools and insights developed from Special Forces expertise to change the way you think, the way you feel and subsequently perform.



ANDY FOX

Andy Fox farms a 1,600 hectare beef and sheep farm in Hurunui, New Zealand, which has been in the family for four generations. In the last thirty years, as he witnessed the devastation caused by both numerous droughts and a massive earthquake, he has developed his own amazing coping strategies. So, when he sees people within his own rural community struggle to cope, he steps up to help. In addition to his farming duties Andy has held numerous leadership roles throughout his career including director of Beef and Lamb New Zealand and the New Zealand Meat Board from 2006 – 2015. He was appointed Chairman of Wool Research of New Zealand in 2019. He is married and has 3 adult sons. In this presentation, Andy will share some of his personal experiences and learnings which he says we can all apply to both work and personal situations. Inspired by her experiences as a part-time carer for her disabled father as a result of his life's work in agriculture, Alex is the Founder of the globally acclaimed #PlantASeedForSafety Project and is a fierce advocate for the health, safety and wellbeing of those in rural industries and communities. With over 14 years' experience in work health and safety, Alex was a regional winner in the 2020 Syngenta Growth Awards, a finalist in the 2020 Weekly Time Shine Awards, was the 2018 AgriFutures Rural Woman of the Year (South Australia) and the winner of the 2018 SafeWork SA Augusta Zadow Award, amongst many others. The proud Director and Principal Consultant of her own consulting business, Alex's core objective is to help her clients recalibrate the value proposition of work health and safety from 'box-ticking' to empowering people, reducing risk, and ultimately preventing people from getting hurt. In hot pursuit of challenging the status quo, Alex adopts concepts from applied psychology, neuroscience, sociology and modern health and safety to help facilitate safer, healthier outcomes for businesses, industries and communities. A Fellow of the Governor's Leadership Foundation and a past member of the Hart Field Site Group Board, Alex's work has been formally endorsed by the Executive Director of SafeWork SA and she loves daring to do things differently. With a farming background and a degree in Animal Science from Edinburgh University, Jonathan Birnie went on to obtain a PhD from the Agricultural Research Institute of Northern Ireland. This was followed by work as a Policy Advisor for the National Farmers Union in England, focusing on livestock. He then worked as Sainsbury's first Agricultural Manager, based in their head office in London before moving to Dunbia where he spent 13 years running agricultural development and research, finishing as Head of Agriculture and Research, with a team spread across the UK. He left Dunbia in August 2017 to set up his new agri-food consultancy business which is heavily involved in strategic development & practical delivery with levy organisations, NGOs, science organisations, commercial businesses and farms. He is a Nuffield Scholar, graduating in 2015 following a study of methods of effecting change in the farming industry.



IORWERTH WILLIAMS

lorwerth Williams is a chartered accountant in Porthmadog, with over 17 years of experience, having qualified with the biggest accountancy firm in the world. RHUN WILLIAMS

Rhun Williams is a first generation farmer who has been living at Ochor, Tregaron for the past seven years. The farm itself covers 45 hectar (ha) and a further 40 ha is rented on a long-term basis. The business runs 650 breeding ewes and also breeds their own replacements. There are also 60 weaned calves at any one time. Rhun values the importance of a forage-based business and over the years he has concentrated on growing forage crops and subsequently improving the grass leys. More recently he has utilised a rotational grazing system as part of being a Farming Connect focus farm.



MATTHEW JACKSON

Matthew Jackson grew up in the city yet harboured an ambition to one day milk his own cows. A determined entrepreneur whose impressive rise within dairying took him from owning no cows to owning more than 1,300 within just 11 years. He has not only achieved that but now owns 150 hectares (ha) of land in west Wales and rents another 270 ha on another enterprise in the same region. Matthew's big break in farming came when he was offered a joint venture by a dairy farmer in north Wales. He says he has never looked back and will explain why.



RHIDIAN GLYN

Coming from a non-farming background, Rhidian began his career as an animal feed sales representative but had his heart set on becoming a farmer. In 2008, he started renting nine acres of poor grazing land for 15 Welsh Mountain ewes and took on any grazing land which came available in the local area. In 2014, Rhidian secured a 10-year farm business tenancy on a 530 acres hill farm. The flock has now grown to 800 ewes and 250 replacements. He also established a heifer rearing enterprise, receiving batches of 100 calves and rearing them for 16 months. He also buys 200 heifers to sell in calf every year, meaning there are over 400 heifers grazing rotationally in the Summer and 280 over the Winter:



PROF.ALICE STANTON

Professor Alice Stanton is a clinician-scientist. She is currently Professor in Cardiovascular Pharmacology at the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, and Director of Human Health at Devenish Nutrition. Particular interests include; the diagnosis and management of high blood pressure, personalized medicine, omega-3 polyunsaturated fatty acids, and most recently, the sustainable production of nutrient-rich foods to ensure healthy diets for all. She currently serves on the Committee developing "Ireland's Agri-food Strategy to 2030" and is an Assembly Member for the Horizon Europe Cancer Mission.

Sophie is an experienced leader in food marketing and a category strategy specialist. Sophie has spent 20+ years in the food industry, training with Mars, as Category Controller at Ginsters and Group Marketing Director for Tulip Foods.
