


Planting with Keep Wales Tidy

Keep Wales Tidy provided Cyclamen plants, dwarf Daffodils, Crocus and Grape Hyacinth bulbs to plant up a bank between our scheme and Castle Park which had been cut back.

Eight children came along to help with the planting. The planting formed part of a wider project funded by Rural ActionCwm Taf to maintain, improve and increase the biodiversity value of hedgerows in the Cwm Taf Rural wards (RCT & Merthyr Tydfil).

The following shows progress against the original targets:

- 2 Training courses in Countryside Management. Progress: Nine modules delivered.
- 3 Green Spaces improved. Progress: 24 green spaces improved across 6x rural wards.
- 5 Habitats improved. Progress: 19 habitats improved.
- 300m₂ Area of land improved. Progress: 784m₂ improved
- 3 Natural / Built heritage awareness raising activities. Progress: Seven activities
- 30 Beneficiaries involved. Progress: 119 beneficiaries in total
