Lessons learned:

This project was designed for parents and toddlers to come together to socialise and play. It is run at very low cost - £1.00 per child. Unfortunately last year we had to shut the group for a few weeks as some of the attendees would use the space as an opportunity to drink coffee and talk with friends but not get involved. As our volunteer also had to leave early the hall was often left dirty and would have to be hoovered and toys put away by other staff members. We decided to close the group for a few weeks while we made some changes

- Advertise for new volunteers
- Change the name of the group to allow a fresh start
- Be clearer with volunteer about expectations, arrange regular catch up meetings to discuss progress

These changes made a difference to the running of the group, clearer expectations for the volunteer and regular opportunities to problem solve any issues that do arise. We now seem to have a regular group sing this service and 15 - 18 children and their parent/carers regularly attend this group
